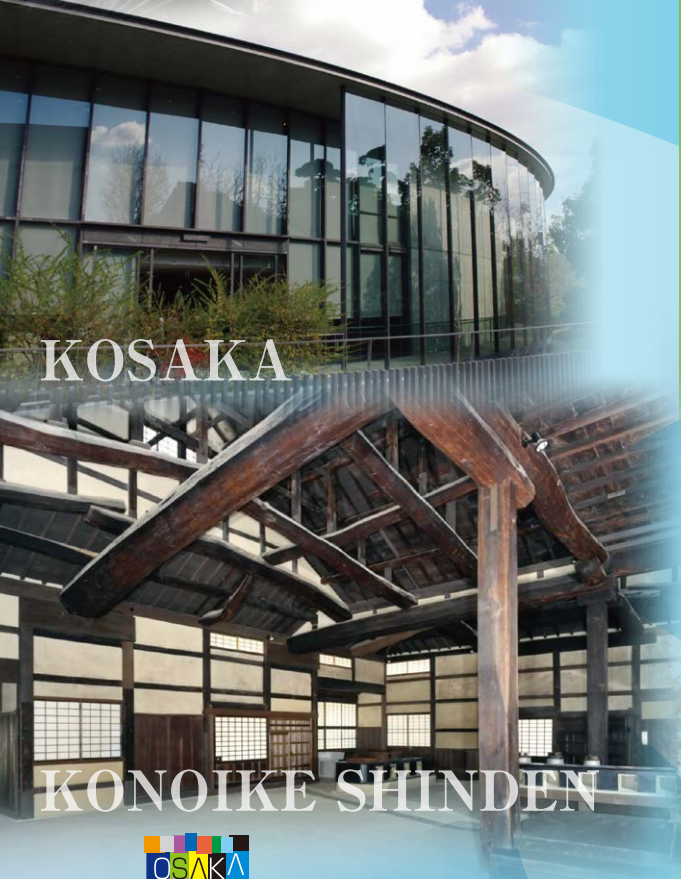

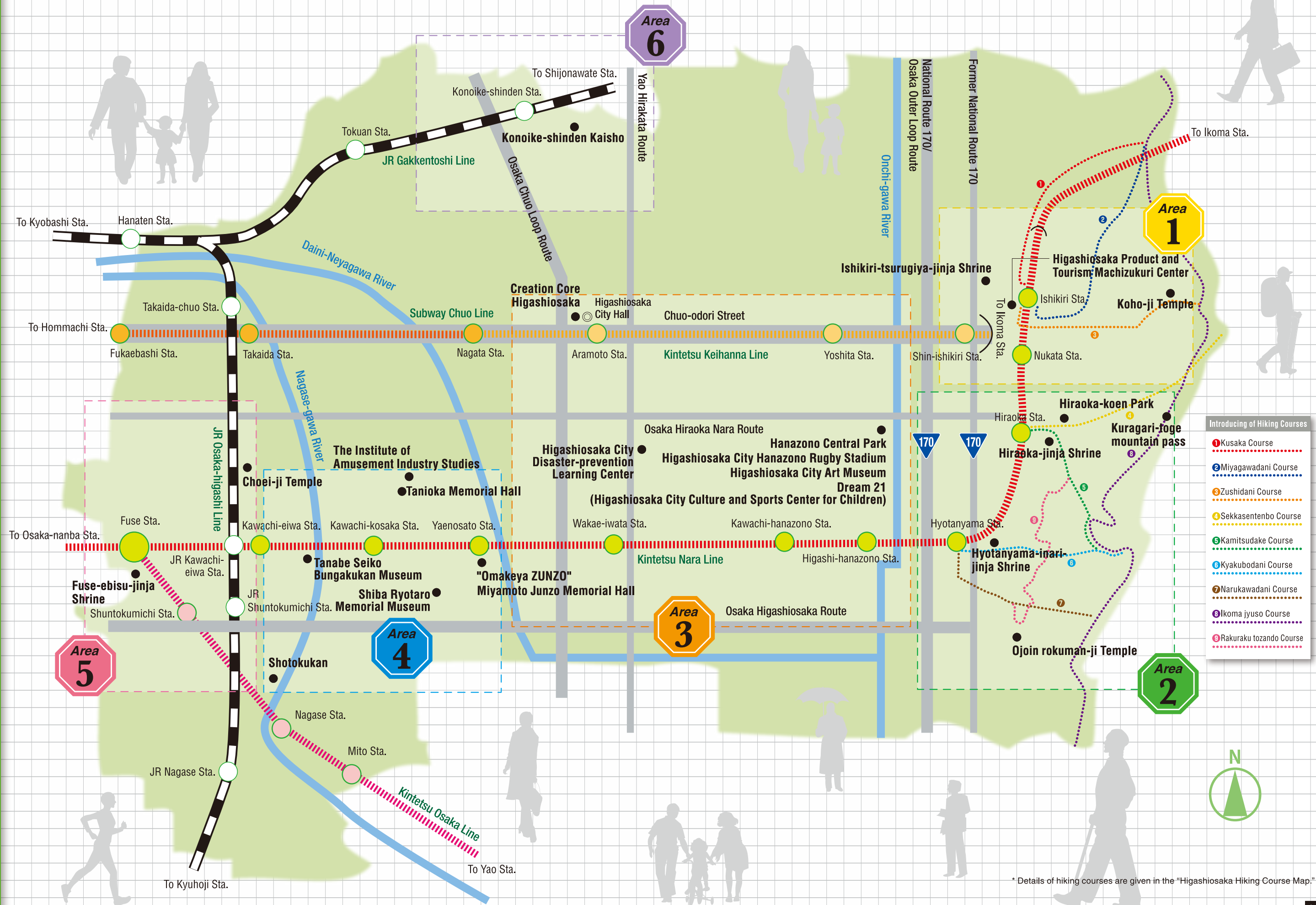

Time travel to streets steeped in history

Must-see spot ◆◆◆

Ishikiri-tsurugiya-jinja Shrine

The shrine name “Ishikiri-tsurugiya” means enshrined objects of worship that are able to cut and penetrate any solid rock. Affectionately called “Ishikiri-san,” the Shrine has a long history and is known nationwide for a god able to heal swellings. The camphor tree standing in front of the main shrine is 500 years old, and is designated as a Natural Monument by Higashiosaka City. The commercial street in the approach to the Shrine is crowded with visitors throughout the year, and still has vestiges of old times.

Koho-ji Temple

Koho-ji temple is located 400 meters up near the top of Ikoma-yama Mountain, going through the mountain road of the Zushi-dani Valley. Its Sango, or mountain name, is Washio-yama, and the temple's principal statue, a wooden thousand-armed, eleven-faced, three-sided Kannon Bosatsu (Kannon Bodhisattva), is said to be the work of the Japanese Buddhist priest Gyoki. The temple is said to have been founded by Ennoyojo, an ascetic who is considered to be the founder of Shugendo, the path of ascetic training. Famous Japanese priests including Gyoki and Kukai are thought to have practiced at this temple too. Within the precinct stand Shigure-zakura cherry trees, which are associated with Emperor Jimmu, showing beautiful colored leaves in November.

Hiraoka-jinja Shrine

Hiraoka-jinja Shrine has a long history as Ichinomiya, the highest-ranked shrine in the Kawachi region, whose name appears on the Englishki list of shrines compiled in the 10th century. Kayu'ura shinji, or rice-gruel divination ceremony, is held at the beginning of every year to bless the harvest of the year using rice porridge with Azuki beans, and many Taikodai, or drum-carrying floats, are carried to the shrine in autumn, creating a splendid and lively scene.

Ojoin temple was used as the headquarters of the Kusunoki army in the battle of Shijo-nawate in 1348. In the precinct stands the grave of the military commander Masatsura Kusunoki. Reservation is required to worship at the shrine.

Hyotanyama-inari-jinja Shrine

The shrine, whose pavilion is built on the west of a gourd-shaped ancient tomb (tomb with two knolls), is the central shrine for the famous “Tsujura” fortune-telling, known for its unique sales pitch since the Edo period that says “plovers flying from the Awaji-shima island to Hyotanyama and reads love fortune telling.” The shrine is deeply associated with the military commander Toyotomi Hideyoshi, and the shrine was used to divine the market price of rice in the Dojima area. The shrine, which used to be surrounded by inns and tea stalls in old times, is now the center of the shopping street in front of the station.

Kuragari-toge mountain pass

Kuragari-toge, is a mountain pass along the Nara-kaido Road, running from the remains of Nikenjaya (two tea stalls) in Tamatsukuri, Osaka, going east through the Kawachi-heiya Plain, to Toyoura, Ikoma-yama Mountain and Yamato, present-day Nara. In the Edo period, the pass developed as an essential transportation route for travelling and distributing goods. The old stone pavements remain to date.

Art space south of Hanazono Rugby Stadium

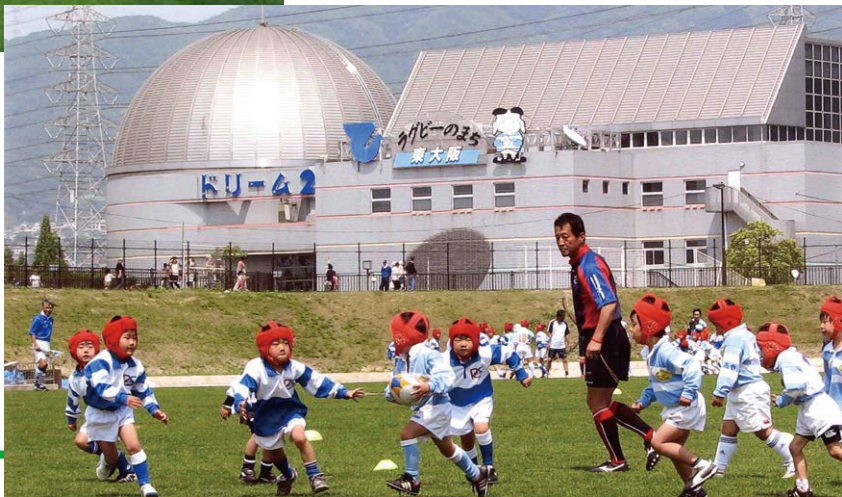

Shoin Gakuen School, Shotokukan

Shotokukan was built as the private residence of Heizo Mori, the founder of Shoin Gakuen School around 1937. Teikoku Kinema Nagase Studio was originally located here, but Mori obtained the site after the studio burnt down in 1930. Precious woods were used to build the residence, and the residence was nationally designated as Registered Tangible Cultural Property in 2000, as being "a model of formative design and difficult to reconstruct."

Tanioka Memorial Hall

(Osaka University of commerce, Museum of Commercial History)

The building of Tanioka Memorial Hall, which was named after the founder of Osaka University of Commerce, used to be utilized as the main building of Osaka Joto School of Commerce, the predecessor of Osaka University of Commerce. The building was repaired as part of the 50th anniversary of the foundation of school, and was designated as a Registered Tangible Cultural Property in 2000. The Museum of Commercial History is located inside the building, it is used as a research and educational facility and also open to public.

Tanabe Seiko Bungakukan Museum

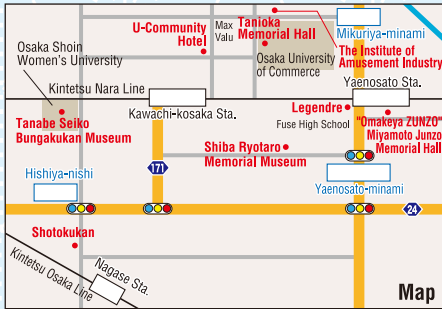

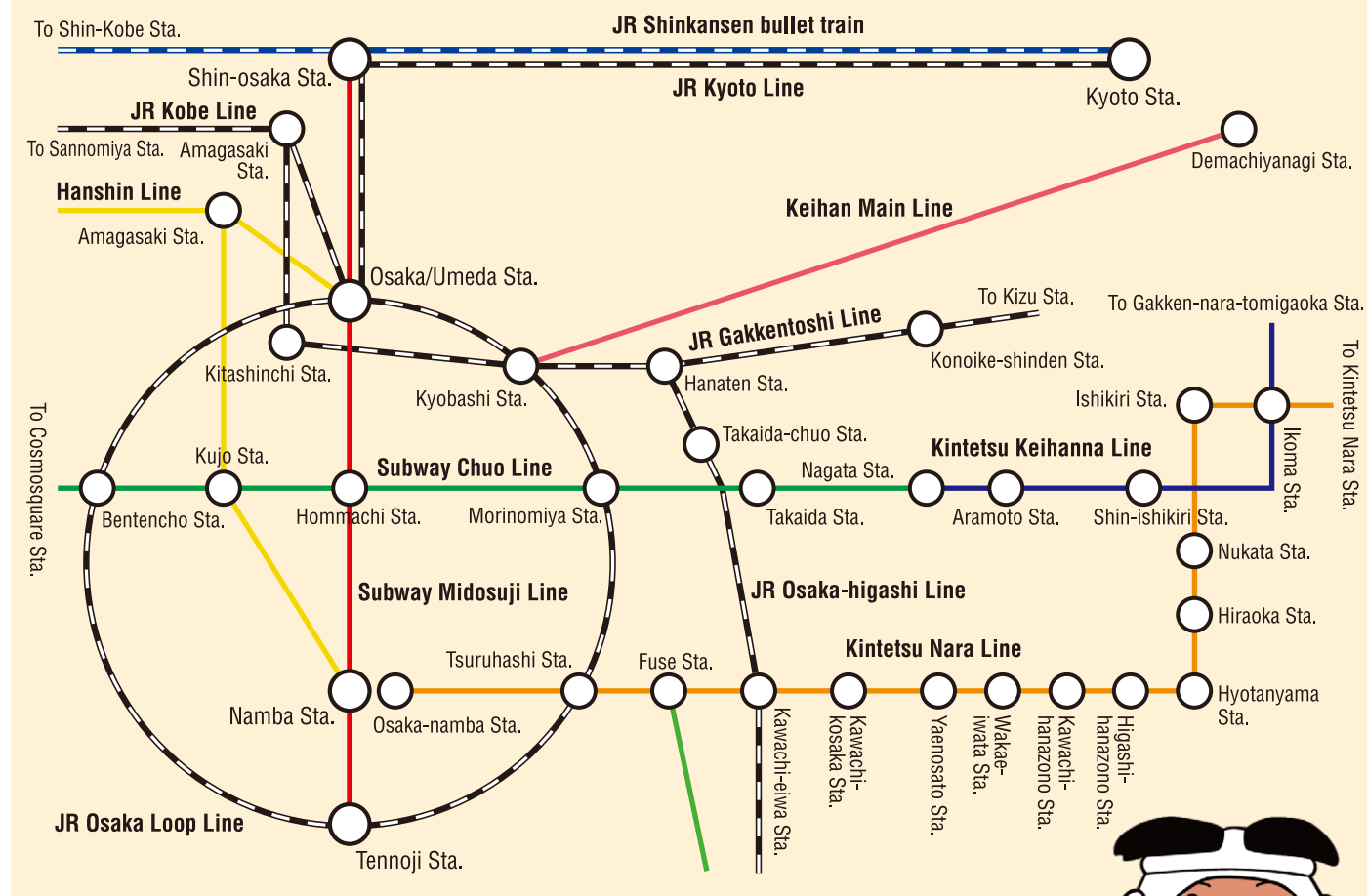
